A.W.F GBV CAMPAIGN: Fellow parishioners, for 365 Days, let us actively campaign and prevent all forms of violence against women and children under the theme ***UNITE to End Digital Violence against All Women and Girls.***

WEEKLY PAYMENTS: Following a meeting of Parish Council, guilds and ministries are urged to consider planning their withdrawals from their saving accounts in advance, instead of requesting a withdrawal on Monday for Friday (for example). This request comes after an in-depth review of the additional charges associated with weekly payments made by the office. To mitigate these additional charges, attempts will be made to only load and release payments twice a month i.e. mid-month and month-end. Exceptions from this will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

PARKING FEE: A few months ago, the Council conducted a survey relating to parking fees. Based on responses from the survey, respondents expressed the view that they are willing to contribute to the cost of parking on Sundays; the preferred parking fee is between R 100.00 and R150.00. The preferred frequency of payment is on Sundays in church and on a monthly basis. The preferred payment methods are a hand held machine in church, and an electronic transfer into the Cathedral account. The reference should be ***Parking***, followed by the name of the Parishioner.

SERVING TEA AND COFFEE AFTER SUNDAY SERVICES: The Parish Council would like to express sincere gratitude to the Guilds, Ministries, and Individuals for their faithful commitment to serving tea and coffee after the 07h30 and 09h30 services. Your generosity is truly valued by the congregation. May we continue to grow together in this spirit of fellowship.

SUNDAY SCHOOL: There is a need for vigilance in safety and security on the church premises. Parents are kindly asked to sit with their children after the communion/blessing as teachers return to their pews in the church and there is no adult supervision when the children are playing outside. Thank you for your continued support.

RECYCLING: The parish has a recycling project of plastic, glass and ordinary bottles. Parishioners are welcome to bring their recycling bottles from home. Let us contribute towards a cleaner environment.

PARISH ROLL: We encourage parishioners who wish to update their details on the Parish Roll to do so by either using the link <https://forms.office.com/r/zJgFGPtIEy> to access the membership form, or by visiting the website <https://www.stalbanscathedral.org.za/> and clicking on the "*membership form*" button at the bottom of the page, or by contacting the office via e-mail at bookkeeper@stalbanscathedral.org.za. For those who would like assistance with updating their details on the parish roll, the Technical Team members are available to help after the service. They will be available with laptops to assist with parish roll registrations and updates. In accordance with the Protection of Personal Information Act (POPIA), the Cathedral Office, the clergy, Churchwardens and Parish Councillors are duty-bound to take adequate precautions in collecting, processing and storing personal information, solely for pastoral connection with parishioners.

REGULATION ON THE SHARING OF PEACE: Parishioners are reminded that the sharing of peace is limited to the forms we currently follow, we continue to wave to each other. If people feel comfortable, they may do a fist or handshake.

REGULATION ON COMMUNION: Parishioners are reminded that communion in two kinds has been made available for those who wish to share in the common cup. As has always been the case, persons who wish may continue to choose to receive communion in one kind only. Intinction (by placing the host into the blood by either the minister or the communicant) is not permitted for health reasons. The person's hand touching the contents of the cup or the clergy touching the communicant's mouth is unhygienic

PARKING: Parishioners who wish to make donations towards the payment of the monthly parking structure are encouraged to do so.

COMMUNICATION: Parishioners who do not receive communication from the Cathedral office are requested to submit their communication details to the office via e-mail.

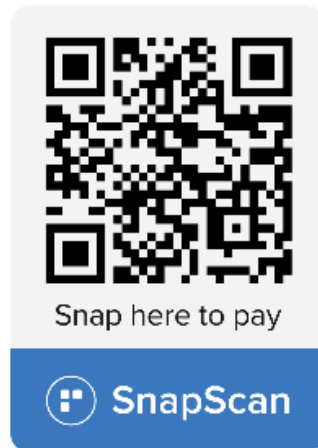

People of this parish, the Councillors and Churchwardens who have been elected are now to be admitted to their office. I ask them to come forward.

I urge you to support these persons in their work for God and in particular to pray for them frequently. Let us now ask God to strengthen them and to guide them in their duties.

Lord, direct these your servants by your Holy Spirit.

Amen

Grant them the gifts of counsel and leadership to build up this parish into a truly Christian community.

Grant that all their works, begun and accomplished in the name of Christ, may witness to your glory.

THE ADMISSION OF PARISH COUNCILLORS

My brothers and sisters in Christ, it is your privilege as Parish Councillors to glorify God through the ministry you share with your Parish Priest. You will serve God by caring for his people. This is why the Canons of our church lay upon you the duty to examine the needs of the community and to take appropriate action concerning worship, evangelism, education, social responsibility and pastoral care. You also have certain responsibilities for the property and finance of the parish.

It is for you to express the parish's care for the general welfare and accommodation of your clergy and their families and to make such provision for them as may be necessary.

As members of the Parish Council you are also required to act upon all matters referred to you by the Bishop, Diocesan Synod and other competent bodies, and through association with other Christians to promote Christian witness and unity.

Do you therefore, for the love of God and of his people, accept these responsibilities?

I declare that, in obedience to my Bishop and in accordance with the Constitution and Canons of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa, I will faithfully and truly execute the office of Parish Councillor within the Parish of St. Alban the Martyr to the best of my skill and knowledge, and for the furtherance of the work of God in this place.

I, Moses Thabethe, Archdeacon of the Cathedral admit you to the office of Parish Councillor in the Parish of St. Alban the Martyr with effect from the Annual Vestry Meeting of this year, enjoining you in the name of the Lord to discharge your office to the utmost of your ability. Therefore be constant in prayer together and study the word of God that you may know his mind.

THE ADMISSION OF CHURCHWARDENS

Dear friends, after prayer, your fellow parishioners have chosen you to be leaders in the things of God. You have won their respect and they look to you to accept the responsibilities of this office. You are not only their principal representative, but also officers of the Bishop, and with the Incumbent you form the executive of the Parish Council.

It is your responsibility:

- To maintain the parish roll;
- To build good relationships among the people and to see to their seating in church without respect of persons;
- To keep the inventories and registers in safety and good order;
- To carry out council policy relating to property and finance;
- And to prepare the budget and accounts for Vestry.

You have special ministry to your Priest, supporting him with your friendship and advice and helping him in every way you can. If anything should go seriously wrong with his life or teaching, or with the way services are conducted, it is your duty, in love, to inform the Bishop so that he can minister to him.

Do you therefore, for the love of God and of his people, accept these responsibilities?

I declare that, in obedience to my Bishop and in accordance with the Constitution and Canons of the Anglican Church of Southern Africa, I will faithfully and truly exercise the office of Churchwarden/Alternate Churchwarden within the Parish of St. Alban the Martyr to the best of my skill and knowledge, and for the furtherance of the work of God in this place.

I, Moses Thabethe, Archdeacon of the Cathedral admit you *N* to the office of Churchwarden/Alternate Churchwarden in the Parish of St. Alban the Martyr with effect from the Annual Vestry Meeting of this year, enjoining you in the name of the Lord to discharge your office to the utmost of your ability.

Make love your aim, and earnestly seek the spiritual gifts, especially faith, wisdom and administration. Take strength from the grace of God which is ours in Christ Jesus.

CONCLUSION

Parish Councillors and Churchwardens, I urge you to co-operate at all times with your Priest, the leader who is set over you in the Lord.

People of this parish; remember the word of St. Paul, "We beg you to acknowledge those who are working so hard among you and in the Lord's fellowship are your leaders and counsellors. Hold them in the highest possible esteem and affection for the work they do. You must live at peace among yourselves. Encourage one another; fortify one another".
